Dear All,

This weekend we keep <u>Good Shepherd Sunday</u>, traditionally a time of prayer for Vocations to the Ministerial Priesthood, but in recent times embracing all Vocations flowing from our Baptism, calling each one of us to be disciples of Christ in the way God wishes.

In our Parish churches you will find photographs of those in our Diocese preparing for Priesthood, so do familiarise yourself with their faces and embed them in your prayers, that their journeys in faith will end in Priestly Ordination.

As our Ten Year Mission Plan begins to develop in earnest, not only should we be praying for more priests but also for discernment of knew vocational callings for the future of our Local Church of the Diocese of Portsmouth. The Permanent Diaconate will be an important element in this prayer-guided development as the availability of priests continues to decline. As is already happening elsewhere, some of our new reorganised Parish Areas may have to depend upon diaconal leadership in place of a priest for most of the time. Also, there is a need to redevelop proper formation for lay men and women to take on this role when no clergy are available. Whilst having a break last week with my brother and his wife in Clifton Diocese, I had a very interesting discussion with a lay woman who had undergone training for this with others. Formerly from our Diocese, the late Bishop Emery, who ordained me, had a great effect upon her as a teenager. The power of witness.

Vocations of all sorts begin with our Christian families, which should be domestic churches, centred on Christ's call in Baptism. A good question to ask this Sunday is: "Is my family a reflection of the Church of which I am a member? A place where Christ is honoured regularly, especially on Sunday, the Day of Resurrection, by Mass attendance, and within which the call to be Missionary Disciples is acknowledged and lived in prayer and Christian witness".

IMPORTANT: Diocesan IT Advisory

Many thanks indeed to Bill Reilly for alerting us to a spam email which was circulating a few weeks ago, purporting to be from Father Patrick. This incident serves to further emphasise the importance of the following Diocesan IT communication which featured in our Newsletter a few weeks ago:

So called 'Spear Phishing' emails on the rise

All Diocesan IT users are urged to be especially alert to a new generation of more sophisticated phishing email tactic, called 'Spear Phishing' If you receive an email from a bank that you've never used before, then it's very likely that you will recognize it's a phishing email and hit delete. But if the email comes from your own bank, you are much more likely to fall for the scam. The scammers add authenticity by names and content which will be familiar to their audience.

In the latest round of emails sent to a number of IT users across the Diocese the attackers <u>used the name</u> of a Priest in active ministry in the signature block, together with our <u>registered charity number</u> to make the emails appear legitimate.

West Berkshire Foodbank

The Foodbank has written to us to provide an overview of 2023 across their Region & to say, once again, how overwhelmed they were with your generosity at Harvest and Christmas last year. In September 2023, the concern was that the stock levels were gradually falling, particularly after the Summer Hungry Holidays scheme. The response to the Harvest Appeal was amazing & the Reverse Advent calendar and 12 Days of Christmas were also very well supported so that the year ended with a very healthy stock level indeed at the warehouse.

With your help, last year the Foodbank distributed over 140 tonnes of stock to:

- individuals and families facing difficulties in West Berkshire through the voucher system;
- support other organisations, like Loose Ends, Home Start, the Soup Kitchen to name a few;
- support Breakfast Clubs in schools;
- run the Hungry Holidays Scheme.

Through the voucher system alone, over 8,000 people were helped, 40% of these were children. Cash donations also enabled clients struggling with energy costs to be supplied with heated throws as well as cheaper to run slow cookers & Air Friers.

However, stock levels have fallen at the start of 2024. With the BBC News reporting that the UK has seen the biggest rise in absolute poverty for 30 years (12 million in 2022-2023), the help provided by Foodbanks is sadly very necessary. With your help, the Foodbank will be able to continue to support those in crisis and help them to find a way out of their problems.
