

ST MICHAEL'S & ST. OSWALD'S PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT: YEAR TO 31 AUGUST 2025

COMMENTS

- 1. The accompanying table shows the parish financial results for the accounting year ended 31 August 2025, and for comparison, also the preceding 4 years.
- 2.Gift Aid tax refund £8,039 is below that in 2024(£12,416) when we had a bigger than normal tax rebate because of delayed claims from 2023.
- 3. The parish's share of money from the Closer to Christ campaign was £6,777: down from £9,684 last year and it will fall to zero in the next 3 years as remaining pledges to the campaign run their course.
- 4."Offertory Collection and Standing Orders" increased by £1,302: an increase of 2.8% over the previous year but below the rate of consumer price inflation 3.7%. Doubtless this reflects the cost-of-living pressures on household budgets and the generous response of many parishioners to the Closer to Christ campaign. This income excludes money given for Second Collections (which are paid over to the diocese or the relevant charity) and the Christmas and Easter offerings for our parish priest.

5.Income in 2025 was boosted by interest of £6,670 on our cash reserves held on deposit. This is not a reliable source of income as interest rates are uncertain and it will fall in future years as cash reserves are used to fund operating deficits.

6.Diocesan levy/Insurance/Council tax £19,023 comprises:

-Diocesan levy £11,424

-Insurance £5,654

-Council tax £1,945

The diocesan levy is over £2,500 lower than last year due to a change in the formula used by the diocese which benefits smaller parishes like ours.

7.Wages £15,761 (£12,658 in 2024) reflect a pay increase in September 2024 for our parish administrator, Dan, and more hours needed to cope with an increased workload due to compliance with ever increasing diocesan requirements.

8. Repairs / Refurbishments £20,780 includes:

- £9,751 on our grounds at both churches including tree surveys, tree surgery, hedge cutting grass
 cutting, and skip hire. The diocese requires parishes to commission regular tree surveys to comply with
 Health and Safety requirements, and we have many trees at St Oswalds, all of which are subject to Tree
 Preservation Orders. Trees at St Michaels have been pruned in part to allow access to carry out work on
 the church roof.
- £5,490 on mandatory inspections, surveys, and servicing of equipment

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

9.In the Diocesan 10 Year Mission Plan (page 12), Bishop Philip writes of his vision for the future:


"It's about not spending all our time, money and energy on ecclesiastical buildings, plant and property, when frankly, there are hardly many people within them, but on directing our resources more intentionally towards the mission".

10. The recent annual Sunday Mass count over 4 weeks in our two churches showed an average of 115 attendees for the whole parish, up from 105 in 2024. St Michaels increased from 80 to 86 and St Oswalds from 25 to 29.

11.As the financial statement shows, our annual income is consistently not enough to pay for the upkeep of the buildings on our two sites. The shortfall is funded by drawing from our cash reserves, but if we continue as we are, the money will eventually run out. In the current financial year 2025/26 we expect our cash reserves to fall by around £80,000 due to an operating deficit for the year and the projected cost of building repairs to St Michael's church roof. The attached graph shows the fall in our cash reserves since 2021.

12. The future of all the parish buildings in the Basingstoke Pastoral Area (6 churches, 4 halls, and 5 presbyteries) will be considered as part of the overall Pastoral Area plan as it develops. This will involve reviewing all the buildings (churches, presbyteries, halls) in the Pastoral Area, identifying those which are surplus to requirements, and developing and implementing a plan for disposal or repurpose in line with the principle of "Prudent Stewardship", which is one of the 3 overarching principles of the Mission Plan.

The parish finance committee will be involved in reviewing the options, and no decisions affecting our buildings will be made without a parish consultation.
