Finally, please keep in prayer the father of Fr. John Lee, our Pastoral Area Coordinator, who died at the beginning of the week. Patrick had been ill for some time. We also keep Cathy his wife in prayer. At our Clergy Meeting on Thursday, at which Fr. John was present, we prayed for him and all his family, especially for the soul of Patrick. Father Jean-Patrice, assistant at Saint Bede's Church, was also in our prayers as he recovers from a serious stroke.

They go on to identify three major threats from: The assisted suicide lobby; Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority (HFEA) and their allies in biotech firms; The abortion lobby.
