Apologies For The Short Notice!

On Tuesday evening 16th May, members of our Parish Finance Committee and I met with Matt Bloomer of the Closer To Christ campaign to discuss aspects of it and to see how we might engage towards the late Summer. I had requested the meeting because we all had concerns about yet another campaign to raise money, especially during the Cost of Living crisis impacting on so many and Mass attendance only slowly returning to pre-pandemic levels following a sharp decline across the Diocese before the virus arrived.

We had expected it to be a general discussion enabling us to outline to you the aims of the campaign over the next couple of months, as at a recent meeting of our Pastoral Area clergy it was my belief that we decided to look to later in the year to engage because of the various pressures affecting us all as clergy. I was taken aback when Matt said that he had come to the meeting believing the involvement to begin immediately! To put it mildly, I was more than irritated, explaining that I am having two weeks of a break in June and with Dan Wisniewski beginning induction as our new part-time Administrator early next week, I have more than enough to do before the end of June. So, we shall definitely not be starting in earnest until the beginning of July, especially as I have to be heavily engaged in the matter.

However, we agreed that it is only right that we should let parishioners know as soon as possible of this campaign. Although we had not received it, I agreed to read a general letter from the Bishop to parishes engaging in the campaign, which will happen this weekend. Following on from this there will be a census taken over the weekend Masses of 27th/28th May (Pentecost) and 3rd/4th June (The Holy Trinity). This will mean that the Sunday morning Masses at Tadley will start without music those weekends and the Psalm will be said as I shall be under considerable pressure to get over to Burghfield Common for 11:00am Mass and the census there.

I take this opportunity to thank those parishioners who have spoken to me recently, sympathising over the recent deaths of long-standing parishioners, of the pressures of trying to cover things without a new part-time Administrator and asking me to take care of myself and get away more regularly. Thank you! And my thanks to Kathryn Garden for all her help and support over the last few months, without which I could not have coped, as she leaves us by the end of next week to concentrate on her role as full-time Administrator at Douai Abbey. I know she will be missed by many of you.

Welcome To Dan Wisniewski

All being well, Dan will be starting as our new part-time Parish Administrator on Tuesday 23rd May. This will involve some considerable time of induction in respect of both diocesan and parish matters, so for the next couple of weeks he will be fully engaged and may be unable to deal with other issues. It would be advisable, if possible, to contact the office with telephone messages if there are issues to be dealt with within a short time span. I shall also be dealing with areas of the induction and the development of the Closer to Christ campaign as parish priest. It may be that there are considerable delays before I get back to people during this time. Apologies for any inconvenience and please keep Dan in your prayers as he engages in this important role. Please remember that the parish office's hours have been reduced to 15 hours to facilitate a pay rise for this role, subject to review with the diocese after six months.
