## Only if the Pope commands!

Parishioners may recall that we have prayed for the church in Nicaragua and for the Bishop Rolando Alvarez of Matagalpa recently. The situation in Nicaragua is causing international concern, although, as is the case with our sister Archdiocese of Bamenda and its problems, there is sadly a dearth of reportage. Bishop Alvarez, alongside others, has been openly critical of the abuse of human rights by the dictatorship of Daniel Ortega and the Sandinista regime. He refused earlier this year to board a flight carrying 222 dissidents, including four priests, deported to the United States which gave them refuge. As a result, without trial, in February he was sentenced to 26 years in prison for "conspiracy, spreading fake news, obstructing and disobeying the authorities" (The Tablet, 15/07/23). He had told a brother Bishop that he would not leave his people unless the Pope ordered him to do so.

The Vatican and the Nicaraguan regime negotiated his release on 4<sup>th</sup> of July, although diplomatic relations with the Vatican had been suspended in March. However, he refused once again to leave the country as he had done nothing wrong. He was returned to prison the next day.

The European Parliament has condemned his detention, and the Inter-American Court of Human Rights called for his release in June. On 7<sup>th</sup> of July 80 prominent Catholics from Spain and Latin America, in support of the suffering of the Nicaraguan church, mentioned him specifically. Below are some details of the statement published by Bishop Declan Lang on behalf of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales:

# "Following the news that Bishop Álvarez has been returned to prison, let us renew our prayers for his safety and freedom.

Bishop Álvarez's imprisonment is a manifestly unjust response to his tireless and courageous work upholding human dignity. We are deeply grateful to everyone across the world who is endeavouring to secure his release.

We pray too for all the people of Nicaragua, especially those in the Church who are being targeted because of their service to others or their commitment to justice and peace."

## CLOSER TO CHRIST CAMPAIGN. THANK YOU!

On Thursday evening this week we had the first of our two open meetings at Saint Michael's Church for parishioners to learn about the campaign as it begins to develop in our Parish.

Matt Bloomer, who has been employed by the Diocese to promote the Campaign, met with me before people came, to update me on progress. He has been in the Parish a number of times, meeting with our Parish Finance Committee and with myself and some parishioners. I was taken aback when he told me that five of our households have pledged over the next three to five years to contribute £28,000 to the support of active and retired priests and the training of seminarians for the priesthood. This means that almost half of the £60,000 target we are asked to raise has been reached. So a sincere thank you for this generosity!

The meeting on Thursday went well with several interesting questions being raised, one of which is being brought back by Matt to our Diocesan Head of Finance. There is another public meeting on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> of July at 11:00 am in Saint Michaels church, after the 10:00 am Mass for the Feast of Saint James. I hope that parishioners will be present for Mass and then the meeting if they were unable to attend the last one. There is a sheet for signing in our churches to indicate that you will be attending this meeting. Then as August begins, the campaign gathers momentum for all parishioners who wish to be involved.
