Masses during August

Please remember our last Parish News before the closure of the Parish office for most of August is on Friday 4th August. The office reopens on Tuesday 29th August. Whilst the weekend Masses continue as normal, please note the following:

Sunday 6th August - The Transfiguration of the Lord:

This major Feast is celebrated on the weekend of 5th/6th August. Readers are reminded that the Liturgy of this Feast replaces the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. <u>The Readings are of Year A in the Lectionary</u>: <u>Daniel</u> and <u>St. Peters Second letter</u> and <u>Psalm 96</u>.

Tuesday 15th August - The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

This is a <u>Holy Day of Obligation</u>, when all Catholics are obliged to attend Mass unless there is a serious reason for not doing so. The Mass times that day will be as follows: 11:00 am - Saint Oswald 's Church 7:00 pm - Saint Michael's Church

Thursday 24th August - St Bartholomew, Apostle:

The feast will be celebrated in Saint Michael's Church at 11:00 am.

IMPORTANT NOTE: During the August period I shall not be generally available, trying to catch up on a backlog of work and having had to rearrange a planned break because of the *Closer to Christ Campaign* which continues to the end of the month.

Closer to Christ Campaign thanks

Our Parish meetings on 20th and 25th of July had good attendances, similar in size to the other Parishes taking part. There were some very pertinent questions asked at both, in respect of transparency and accountability, and I am grateful for the straightforward, polite way in which they were addressed to myself and Matt Bloomer, who is organising the campaign for the diocese.

Things will now gather momentum, with most parishioners being made aware of the nature and reason of the Campaign and inviting them to be involved and to make pledges over the next three to five years if possible (which can be cancelled at any time should personal circumstances change).

It is important to note that contributions to the Offertory and Special Collections in the Parish should continue as normal. It is therefore requested, if individual parishioners/families consider it possible to make a pledge to the Campaign (after due consideration of personal circumstances

during these difficult financial times for all), that these should not be at a level which could result in a reduction to the usual Parish collections.

I have decided not to see any of the pledges made, these being personal to those making them in whatever form. However, I take this opportunity to thank those who have pledged so generously so far and to those who have assured me they will be pledging once they have taken some time for consideration of their financial situations.

March For Life UK

The most important freedom is the right to life from conception to natural death; a right which the Catholic Church sees as God-given. For a nation to be truly free, that right must be carefully upheld and promoted, else other rights pertaining to the human being are eroded for personal convenience or political expediency.

Illegal Migration Bill

Bishop Terence Drainey, Chair of Caritas Social Action Network, has urged Catholics to make their voices heard on the Illegal Migration Bill that will now become law. Together with the Charity's CEO, Raymond Friel OBE, he made the following statement on Thursday, 18 July:

We at Caritas Social Action Network are deeply concerned that the Illegal Migration Bill will now become law after a series of votes in the House of Lords did not succeed in securing modern slavery protections or limits to the detention of children.

In our previous statement, in March 2023, we urged the Catholic community to speak out against this "cruel and unworkable Bill which is an affront to human dignity and a breach of our responsibilities to the global common good and our obligations under international law."

Earlier this year, the Department for International Affairs of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales published 'Love the Stranger', a Catholic response to refugees and migrants.
