## The Illegal Immigration Bill

Serious concern is being expressed in Christian and Human Rights organisations about this Bill, which was recently passed by Parliament in spite of considerable opposition within the House of Lords.

On 14th March, the Department for International Affairs of the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales published *Love the Stranger: A Catholic Response to Migrants and Refugees*, outlining important principles to be considered. Last week's Parish News published the statement of Bishop Terence Drainey of Caritas Social Action Network, urging Catholics to engage in the debate.

Of particular concern is the fact that, in spite of the intervention of former Prime Minister Theresa May, modern anti-slavery protections were not secured and there are also elements of the detention of children unresolved. Questions are being raised about a breach of the UN Refugee Convention, to which the United Kingdom is a signatory since its establishment. Also, about the lack of safe routes being established for those legitimately seeking asylum, to say nothing of the need to overhaul an asylum request system which is not working effectively, leaving a growing backlog of cases and increasing public expenditure. One should never forget that the dignity of the human person is central to any response concerning migrants and refugees, whilst respecting the right of a state to control its borders.
