New Part-Time Administrator

Following a successful interview on Thursday 27th April in the Parish Room, Daniel Wisniewski has accepted the post of part-time Administrator for Tadley and Burghfield Common, effective from 24th May. He replaces Kathryn Garden, who deserves our thanks for continuing to work reduced hours, alongside being full-time Administrator at Douai Abbey, to ensure that important parish and diocesan matters have been covered for several months. She has also developed the role of part-time Secretary into that of an Administrator as we develop the 10 Year Plan and its demands, for which the Diocese is very grateful. She will be greatly missed.

Daniel is married with two children and worships at St Bernadette's Church, Pangbourne, which comes under the Douai Abbey Parish. It will take him some time to become embedded in the new role, and during May, and for some time after, the Parish Office will not be as accessible as in the past, as the hours of work will be reduced in line with a pay increase, advocated by the Diocese. Kathryn and I shall be clearing a big backlog of work. Office hours will probably have to be adapted, but more of all this next month. My thanks to Karena Fulford, Head of Human Resources, who travelled to Tadley from Portsmouth to lead the interview, to Barry Rockhill of Burghfield Common and a member of our Finance Committee, and to Kathryn, who joined me in detailing the changing aspects of the new post. I look forward to working with Daniel and I am certain that you will make him welcome.

Synod: Laymen and Laywomen eligible to vote at General Assembly

The October 2023 General Assembly in the Vatican on the theme of synodality is set to change, since a sizeable group of "non-bishop" members will also take part. These 70 individuals will include lay people appointed directly by the Pope, 50 percent of whom shall be women and among whom shall be included several young people. All 70 will enjoy voting rights at the Assembly, which will consist of around 370 voting members.

This information has been circulated by our Bishops' Conference of England and Wales as the Synod Process continues to gather momentum. The Vatican has made it clear that "this is not a revolution but an important change" introduced by Pope Francis recently. The title 'Synod of Bishops' remains in place, and no current regulations have been repealed, because the 2018 Constitution for the Synod already provided for the presence of "non-bishops". These "non-bishops" will represent "various groupings of the faithful of the people of God (priests, consecrated women, deacons, lay faithful)".

It is obvious that Pope Francis wants the Synodal Process to include, as far as possible, all facets of the Universal Church, including the right to vote on issues which concern them as well as the Bishops themselves. As was commented at the conclusion of the presentation of changes "the Church will be more complete, and it will be a joy to have her represented in her entirety in Rome" at the October meeting. I suggest that this very much fits in to my Homily for Good Shepherd Sunday in respect of the 10 Year Mission Plan for our Diocese, during which I spoke of the need for us to reclaim the

importance of Baptism as the centre of all vocations and ministries in the Church. This recognises the call to all the baptised to be involved in the development of our Christian witness, whether Bishop, Priest, Permanent Deacon, Religious or Laity, working together as one body in Christ. In truth, the Church is more complete in its entirety when all members are participating as the Gathered Church under Christ, recognising the particular call of Our Saviour for each one of us to spread the Good News in the way He wills. As Bishop Philip says, "We are not Lone Rangers"!
